

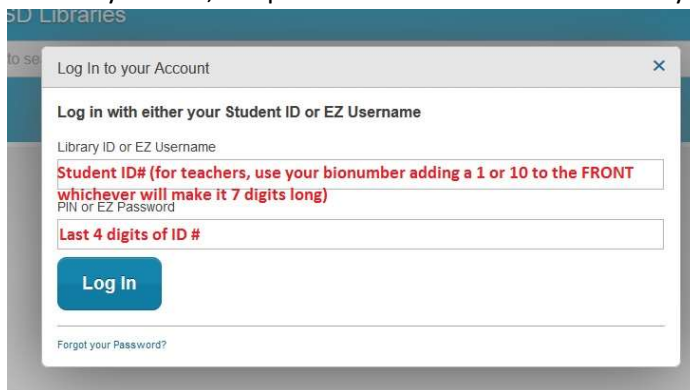
Using Gale Database for Research

General:

1. From the library website, choose **Databases**.



2. If you are using the databases **from home or somewhere else off campus**, log onto your account. The user name is your ID#, the password is the last 4 numbers of your password). Teachers, see example below.

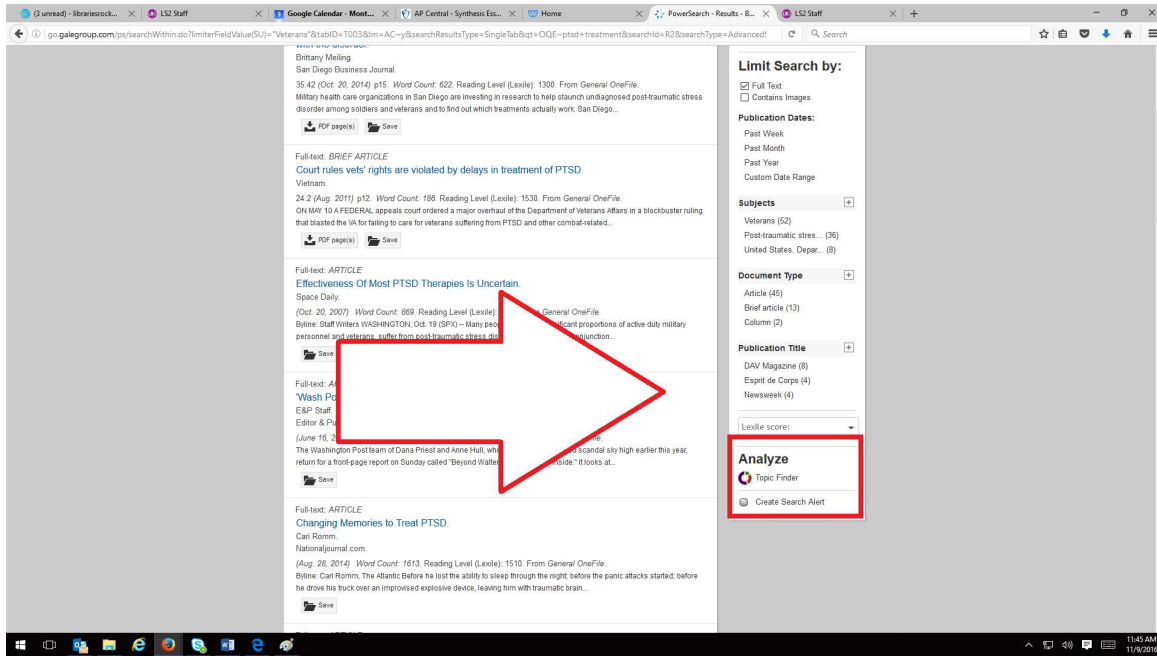

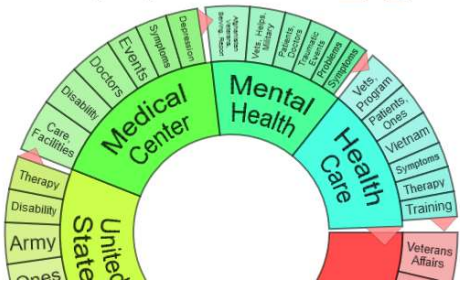
